



La critica sociologica n° 200

No. 200 of “La critica sociologica”, a quarterly review founded by Franco Ferrarotti in 1967 and still under his control, has been published and is now available. The fact that the review has lasted so long is particularly interesting in the light of the fact that it has never been strictly academic although it has always published prestigious scholarly names, usually university teachers. The editor asks himself, in the introduction, “Where are we coming from and where are we going?”, followed by short contributions by scholars who have for years been in contact with the review: sociologists such as Michel Maffesoli, who teaches in Paris 5, the Sorbonne; E. Doyle McCarthy from NYU; Arta Musaraj, editor in chief of “Academicus International Scientific Journal”, now vice-provost for International Relations and Scientific Research of Tirana’s “Luarasi” University; Gaston Pineau, who has collaborated for many years of the theme of memory. We find also well-known experts and travelling companions from other disciplines like the philosophers Giuliano Campioni (famous Nietzsche scholar) and Carlo Sini. Finally, Italian sociologists Enzo Pace (University of Padua), Enzo Mingione (Bicocca University of Milan) and Enrico Pugliese (University of La Sapienza, Rome), who have been our friends for years.

The articles in this issue are mainly concerned with the review’s historical role (Musaraj), the main subjects it has dealt with (Mingione, Pugliese) and Franco Ferrarotti’s thought (Pineau, Sini). Some of the articles are specifically dedicated to Franco Ferrarotti (Campioni).

In addition, a synopsis of all previous issues, starting from No. 1, spring 1967, is presented: since pages 77 to 167 are dedicated to the synopsis one can understand the great work that has been done by this review over the years.
